

URGENT CARE VS. EMERGENCY CARE

Use Urgent Care to supplement your family doctor's care after office hours, on the weekend or if you are unable to get an appointment.

Use Emergency Care for accidents or illness not treatable at your physician's office or matters of life or death.

Urgent Care should be used for:

- Allergies
- Asthma Attack (*Minor*)
- Cold, Flu, Fever
- Cough
- Dizziness
- Fractures
- High Fever
- Insect Bites
- Nausea
- Minor Burns
- Minor Cuts/Lacerations
- Minor Head Injury
- Pink Eye
- Rash
- Sore Throat
- Sprains
- Stitches

Emergency Care should be used for:

- Chest Pain
- Compound Fractures (*Bone Visible*)
- High Fever
- Ingestion of Obstructive Objects
- Ingestion of Poisons
- Major Head Injury
- Seizures
- Severe Abdominal Pain
- Severe Asthma Attack
- Severe Burns
- Shock
- Snake Bites
- Unconscious or Catatonic State
- Uncontrollable Bleeding



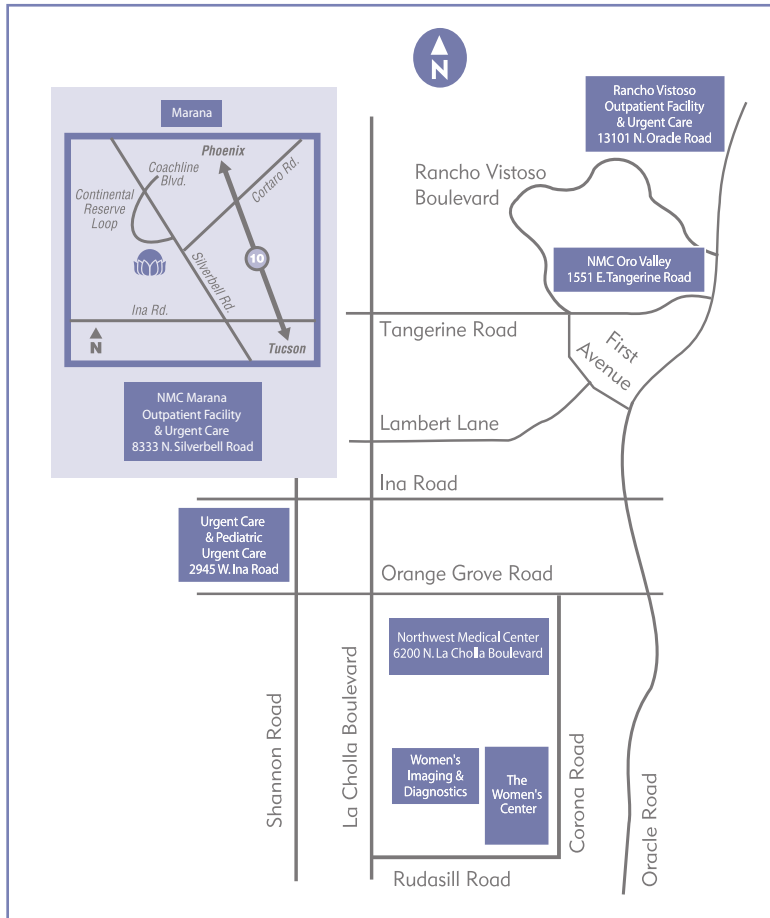
